### WHAT IS ORDINARY TIME?

### ORDINARY TIME THROUGH THE WEEK

Early Church history and tradition teaches that each day of the week has a theme which can help us to celebrate Ordinary Time. Here are some fun and simple activities you could choose to celebrate.

### Saturday—Honor The Blessed Mother

This day is dedicated to the Blessed Mother. Pope Paul VI's apostolic exhortation Marialis Cultus states: "The Catholic's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship." At Fatima, Mary asked all people to honor her on the first Saturday of five consecutive months by attending Mass and confession, saying the Rosary, and meditating for fifteen minutes on one or more of the mysteries of the Rosary. Even if you are unable to make this devotion, any special remembrance of the Blessed Mother would be a step in the right direction. You could simply place fresh flowers before an image of Mary or pray a decade of the Rosary after dinner. Any gesture will be gladly accepted by Our Lady, who longs for our love and affection.

# As a family you could also:

- 1. Make a Marian shrine in your home
- Start a novena
- 3. Thank a spiritual mother
- 4. Memorize a prayer to Mary
- 5. Write Mary a poem

Even though Ordinary Time doesn't build to a single great feast like Advent or Lent, it is not without high points. The Assumption of Mary (August 15th) All Saints (November 1), and Christ the King (November 22nd) are just a few of the important celebrations that fall during Ordinary Time.

First Friday Devotion, Friday August 2 directly following the 8:30AM Mass.

Saturday Rosary Devotion, Saturday August 3 directly following the 9:00AM Mass. This does not meet your obligation for weekend Mass.

### WHY DO WE "HAVE TO" GO TO MASS?

Whether you are eight years old or in your eighties, at some point in your life you have probably struggled with this question.

### Here are ten good reasons to go to Mass:

- God asks us to make one day holy. God asks us to set aside one day to refocus physically, mentally, and spiritually. We live in a secular world. Going to Mass helps us to see everything from a different perspective. We begin to see in the depths of our being that God is in charge. We can let go of our own agenda because we know that God will inspire us, guide us, and strengthen us for the week ahead.
- Jesus gives us the gift of Himself. When we go to Mass we are doing what Jesus commanded his followers to do. It is a command to love and be loved by God. Jesus offers Himself to us in the Word of God that we hear and in His real presence, offered to us in the Blessed Sacrament at Communion.
- 3. We need to be part of a community. When we come together at Mass to pray and worship God, we fulfill a deep need inside of us to be in communion with other people. The other parishioners—even if we don't know all of them—give us support, affirmation, and encouragement in our attempt to live the Gospel message. They help us to see that we are not alone. They remind us that we are all part of the Body of Christ.
