WHY DO WE "HAVE TO" GO TO MASS?

Whether you are eight years old or in your eighties, at some point in your life you have probably struggled with this question. (cont. from previous bulletin)

Here are ten good reasons to go to Mass:

4 God has a special message for us. When we listen to the readings, the homily, and the prayers of the Mass, God speaks to us in a special way. We should come away from each Mass with at least one inspiration that will impact our lives in some way. We just have to pay attention and be open to what the Lord is trying to tell us.

- 6. <u>People need our prayers.</u> We can pray for other people any time, but when we pray for others during Mass, we pray in a special way. It doesn't matter whether the other people are separated from us by distance or by death. The Mass brings us together in the Body of Christ and we become the communion of saints. It is part of the cosmic dimension of the Mass that unites heaven and earth by reaching across time and space.
- 7. We need to stand up for what we believe. Being a follower of Jesus is counter-cultural. At every Mass we have the opportunity to stand up and proclaim what we believe publicly. We admit that we believe in God, in Jesus, in the Holy Spirit, in the Catholic Church, in the communion of saints, in the forgiveness of sins, and in life after death. It is a powerful statement of allegiance and an opportunity to recommit ourselves. (continued in next bulletin)
