The Saints Who Saved Lives With Beer

Drink to good health! That has been the cry of saints and popes as they have served mugs of beer to the sick. In times of plague, members of the church have used beer to fight disease.

St. Brigid of Kildare - St Brigid (c.421-525) also lived during a time when beer was brewed to sanitize and add nutrients to river water. Beer was considered liquid bread because it contained many of the same nutrients. Legend holds that St. Brigid quenched the thirst of lepers and gave them nourishment by turning water into beer and that she miraculously supplied beer to churches.

St. Brigid is believed to be the author of an eleventh-century poem that honors beer by declaring:

I'd like to give a lake of beer to God,

I'd love the heavenly Host to be tippling there for all eternity.

I'd sit with the men, the women, and God

There by the lake of beer,

We'd be drinking good health forever

And every drop would be a prayer.
