WHAT DOES THE BIBLE HAVE TO SAY ABOUT ANGELS?

What are angels? The word “angel” comes from the Greek word “aggelos” meaning “Messenger.” This does not so much refer to what they are as to what they have done visibly to human beings. St. Gregory refers to angel as the “name of the office” which does not refer to the nature of these spiritual beings or their essential functions.

The essential function of the angels is to attend to God's throne in the heavenly court. The prophet Daniel relays a vision of the heavenly court. He says, “...thrones were placed, and the Ancient of Days took His seat; His clothing was white as snow, and the hair of His head like pure wool; His throne was fiery flames, its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and came out from before Him; a thousand thousands served Him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before Him; the court sat in judgment, and the books were opened (Daniel 7:9-10).”

There are countless hosts of angels serving Almighty God!

Angels as Messengers to Mankind. Daniel's vision of the heavenly court is quite rare. There are only occasional times where God has allowed human beings to glimpse the angels. Generally, angels in the Bible appear as God's messengers. This is why we use the term “angel.” The angels faithfully serve the Lord and make known His perfect will to man.
