

THE JUBILEE INDULGENCE

How can I receive the Jubilee Indulgence?

During the Jubilee year, you can receive a Plenary Indulgence once per day (if the essential components have been met) by making a pilgrimage or an act of penance or mercy. Some examples include:

<u>Works of penance</u> - Fasting from social media or not buying unnecessary items.

<u>Acts of mercy</u> - Spending time with lonely elderly people, helping the sick or disabled, assisting those in need, volunteering at or financially supporting apostolates such as Catholic Charities or Respect Life.

<u>Pilgrimage</u> - Taking a prayerful pilgrimage to a Jubilee Church and going to Mass, praying the Stations of the Cross, or praying the Rosary. To encourage Pilgrims of Hope, the Church has designated particular parishes as Jubilee Churches, a place for pilgrims to gather in prayer and an opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence.

Bishop Golka has designated the following Churches in the Diocese of Colorado Springs as Jubilee pilgrimage sites:

- St. Mary's Cathedral Colorado Springs
- Holy Family Leadville
- St. Dominic Parish Colorado Springs
- Sacred Heart Parish Cheyenne Wells
- St. Francis of Assisi Parish Castle Rock
- St. Peter Chapel Cripple Creek (diocs.org) (continued in future bulletins)

Five Tips On How To Receive The Eucharist

2. Observe the 1 hour Eucharistic fast. Again, this one is also a requirement... Can 919: "One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion". This doesn't apply to those who are sick or elderly. It is great to know the requirements, buy why does the Church require us to do this?

There are two main reasons:

First, mortification is good and helps us to grow in spiritual discipline.

Second, the physical hunger we feel should remind us of the hunger and thirst we should have for the Eucharist.

And really, one hour isn't that long. The fast used to begin the midnight preceding receiving the Eucharist.

<u>Lectors/Readers</u> - Anyone can be a reader. There is minimal training needed to proclaim God's Word during Mass. Schedules are created quarterly and in most instances readers will only need to read once a month. It is at your discretion whether you prefer to read at Saturday or Sunday Mass.
