Reasons for Hope Today

The New Mission of the Laity

One of the great fruits and signs of hope that came from the renewal of Vatican II was a new and vibrant mission of the laity to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to the ordinary places of our secular culture. As the Council teaches, "The lay apostolate, however, is a participation in the salvific mission of the Church itself. Through their Baptism and Confirmation all are commissioned to that apostolate by the Lord Himself. Moreover, by the sacraments, especially holy Eucharist, that charity toward God and man which is the soul of the apostolate is communicated and nourished. Now the laity are called in a special way to make the Church present and operative in those places and circumstances where only trough them can it become the salt of the earth" (Vatican II, Lumen Gentium, 33). This personal call of the Lord to every layperson in the Church is a great sign of hope, as well as a call for all lay people "to give a glad, generous, and prompt response to the impulse of the Holy Spirit and to the voice of Christ, who is giving them an especially urgent invitation at this moment. Young people should feel that this call is directed to them in particular, and they should respond to it eagerly and magnanimously." (Christifideles Laici, 2)

In this Year of Hope, I strongly encourage all lay people, especially young people, to take up this call to be Christ's witnesses wherever he leads you, especially in marriage and family life. Yours is a witness that is indispensable to the mission of the New Evangelization and the building up of a civilization of life and love.

What is a Mass Intention? Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics the Church provides for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention. A Mass intention is a specific petition for which the Mass is offered. Mass intentions can be requested on behalf of another living person—for example, the healing of someone who is sick—or to commemorate a wedding anniversary. However, Mass intentions are most commonly offered in remembrance of a person who has died.

We don't "pay for Masses," because we cannot possibly afford it, since the value of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is infinite. But it's good for the faithful to request a Mass for a specific intention and at the same time to make an offering to the priest to help support him. The usual stipend for the priest is \$10.
